Life aboard the AVRO Lancaster

Please join us for this special Remembrance Day-themed lunch on **November 7th at 11:30am** (NOTE: one week earlier than normal).

What do we know about this incredible WW2 aircraft and what was life like on board??? This presentation will explore the unique development and capabilities of the Lancaster heavy bomber - an icon of World War II; the threats crew confronted flying into enemy airspace and why flying on a Lancaster was so dangerous and emotionally stressful for the young crew, who's average age was 21-22.

John Bullen from the Canadian Warplane Heritage Museum will also include a brief history of the Museum's flying Lancaster - only 1 of 2 left flying in the world!! Everyone Welcome!

At the beginning of the Offertory hymn the bread and wine (gifts of the people) are brought to the Altar by two members of the congregation and are presented to a server at the altar rail in preparation for consecration before Communion. The bread, wine and the collection presented by the sides people at the end of the hymn represent our lives, our work, our recreation, our families, and our community.
