IMPORTANT MESSAGE REGARDING THE MADAGASCAR MISSIONS

As you know, for very many years St. Luke's Church has supported Mary Sherwood and her important work at the 2 mission centres in Madagascar, an orphanage and an inner-city centre. Several years ago Mary suffered a stroke and had to retire from this work. During the time that the Anglican Mission Services Committee (AMSC) was searching for a replacement, we received no updates about the missions. While we did receive guarantees that any donations were still going to directly support work there, it has proven very difficult to keep parishioners engaged without information to share and consequently support has dwindled. In the spring we received word that Mary's replacement had been found and we were looking forward to once again getting things back on track. Unfortunately, that has not happened. We know that the replacement visited Madagascar in the summer, but we have received no news.

After much discussion, the Outreach Committee has made the difficult decision to end our ongoing relationship with AMSC. We do however want to stress that both the Madagascar Missions are still very much 'alive' and that individual support is very welcome. If and when we receive any updates we will pass the information along in the bulletin or newsletter.

We thank all the parishioners who have generously donated to this very worthy cause over the last 30+ years. We will accept donations to Madagascar Missions through St. Luke's until December 31st of this year.
